# PUBLICATIONS HIGHLIGHT

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*Research & Scholarly Output during August 2025 – December 2025*

The faculty and students of Guru Nanak College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Dehradun have continued to contribute to pharmaceutical literature through peer-reviewed research papers published in reputed national and international journals. These publications span areas such as herbal drug formulation, nanoparticle preparation, phytochemistry, drug delivery systems, ocular therapeutics, antimicrobial resistance, environmental toxicology, clinical pharmacy, and pharmacognosy – reflecting both the breadth of our departmental research interests and the depth of our commitment to original scientific work.

Over the broader period documented across our newsletter issues, our faculty have authored or co-authored more than twenty research papers in refereed Scopus and SCI-indexed journals. In parallel, they have contributed ninety-plus book chapters to recognised pharmaceutical publications, serving as reference material for students across the country. Notable journals in which our work has appeared include the Journal for Research in Applied Sciences and Biotechnology, the International Journal of Pharmaceuticals and Healthcare Research, the Journal of Chemical Health Risks, Catalysts, Frontiers in Microbiology, ACS ES&T Water, Vaccines (MDPI), Applied Biochemistry and Biotechnology, and many more.

The College actively encourages a culture of research through its dedicated Research Club, regular workshops on literature review and scientific writing, training on statistical and reference-management tools, and a sustained emphasis on publication ethics. Final-year students are guided through dissertation projects that increasingly result in peer-reviewed publications.
